Doug Dillard, with his wife Marion, served Trinity for eight years (1981-1989) as Senior Minister and returned when he retired from active ministry in 2000 to serve as Minister of Congregational Care for three and a half more years. An eloquent teacher and scholar, Dr. Dillard graduated from Wesley Theological Seminary and Oberlin College Graduate School of Theology. He served as Director of the Virginia Conference Council on Ministries and as District Superintendent of the Alexandria and Norfolk Districts, and he held numerous leadership positions in the broader church.
