UNION PRESBYTERIAN SEMINARY

Union Presbyterian Seminary celebrates the class of 2021.

Since its founding in 1812, Union Presbyterian Seminary has served the Presbyterian Church by educating pastors and teachers, missionaries, and scholars for service to Christ and the world. The "Union" in the seminary's name represents the partnership of the synods of Virginia and North Carolina on behalf of theological education.

Since 1898, the seminary has been located in Richmond, Virginia. Union Theological Seminary federated with the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (formerly the Assembly's Training School for Lay Workers) to become Union-PSCE in 1997.

In 2002, an extension campus of Union-PSCE was established in Charlotte, North Carolina, and in September 2012, the Charlotte campus of Union Presbyterian Seminary moved to its own building on the campus of Sharon Presbyterian Church.

In July 2010, Union-PSCE changed its name to Union Presbyterian Seminary to reflect a collective vision for the future and to signify the new creation that God is forming out of this historic seminary.

Union Presbyterian Seminary provides a variety of degree programs for those seeking to serve the church of Jesus Christ. Students are currently enrolled in the following degree programs: Master of Divinity, Master of Arts in Christian Education, Master of Divinity/ Master of Arts in Christian Education, Master of Theology, Doctor of Ministry, and Doctor of Philosophy.

The faculty at Union Presbyterian Seminary have given the institution a reputation for excellence. These scholars, teachers, and preachers express a profound and vital Christian faith, and have written hundreds of books, articles, and curricula that have had an important effect on the life of the contemporary Christian church.

Brian K. Blount, president of Union Presbyterian Seminary, is a leading scholar of the New Testament. A native of Smithfield, Virginia, he served as a pastor and a church educator in Newport News, Virgina. He served with distinction as professor of New Testament at Princeton Theological Seminary from 1992 until 2007.

Union Presbyterian Seminary has approximately 167 students enrolled in programs to prepare for ministry as pastors, educators, and scholars in service to the church. They represent three nations and more than 15 states.
