

from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, CA, and his Ph.D. degree from Duke University. He is the author of *The Christian Imagination: Theology and the Origins of Race*, one of the most important books in theology written in the last 25 years and now a standard text read in colleges, seminaries, and universities. Jennings is also the recipient of the 2015 Grawemeyer Award in Religion for his groundbreaking work on race and Christianity. He recently authored a commentary on the Book of Acts published by Westminster/John Knox and is currently working on a book on the doctrine of creation, tentatively entitled, *Reframing the World*.

.Jennings is a regular workshop leader at pastor conferences and a consultant for the Wabash Center for Teaching and Learning in Theology and Religion, and for the Association of Theological Schools.

Jill Duffield (M.Div.'96) currently serves as the editor and publisher of *The Presbyterian Outlook*, an independent publication on the PC(USA). She earned a B.A. in history from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, graduating magna cum laude and as a member of Phi Beta Kappa. She graduated with her Master of Divinity from Union Presbyterian Seminary in 1996 and was ordained as a teaching elder in 1998. In May, 2013, Jill earned her Doctor of Ministry from Austin

Presbyterian Theological Seminary. She has served large and small congregations, led numerous retreats, and has had articles, sermons and curricula published. She was the 2015 recipient of the Associated Church Press James Solheim Award for Editorial Courage. In addition, Jill is frequently asked to preach and has had the privilege of preaching at the Massanetta Springs Bible Conference and the Montreat Conference Center. Jill is married to Grant and they have three children—Joseph, Jessie, and Marissa.

2018 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS

One Ho Park (Ed.D.'89) has been president of the Graduate School of Practical Theology in Seoul, Korea since June 2017. He was the senior pastor of Presbyterian Church of the Lord, Seoul, Korea for 10 years. He received a Ed.D. from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education, a Th.M. in Christian Education from Princeton Theological Seminary, his M.Div. from Presbyterian College and Theological Seminary in Seoul, Korea, and a B.A. in English Literature from Keimyung University in Taegu, Korea.



From 2003–2007, Park served as senior pastor of Korean Presbyterian Church of Metro Detroit in Southfield, MI. From 2000–2003 he served as co-pastor of Arumdaun Church in Long Island, NY. He served from 1994–2000 at Presbyterian College and Theological Seminary in Seoul, Korea as both professor and associate professor. Park is married to Ho Soon Shinn. They have two children and two grandchildren, Ellie and Lehnah. He began his term on the Union board of trustees in 2014.

Karen Brown (M.Div.'92) serves as a pastoral associate at Grace Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, MD, and as the resource developer for Intersection of Change, a non-profit organization offering a myriad of services to the underserved Baltimore community. She received her Bachelor's Degree from Towson University in Townson, MD, a Master of Divinity from Union Seminary in Richmond, VA, and a Doctorate in Metro Urban

Ministry from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in New Brunswick, NJ.

Brown served simultaneously as the associate pastor of the Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church from 1994 to 2005 and as the executive director of the Madison Avenue Family Life Center until 2009. She has served on various committees within the Presbytery of Baltimore and as an advisor to the Youth Advisory Delegates for two consecutive General Assemblies.
